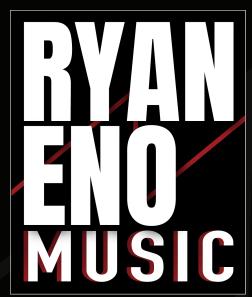
Logo:

There is a red line behind the text that represents a 'sawtooth' waveform which will be recognized by musicians and audio professionals.

Logo Use:

Minimum Size

The minimum height for the horizontal logo is suggested to be 1 inch and the minimum height for the vertical logo is suggested to be 1.25 inches. The minimum size rules may be broken when used for smaller applications but the logo needs to maintain its proportions and be legible.

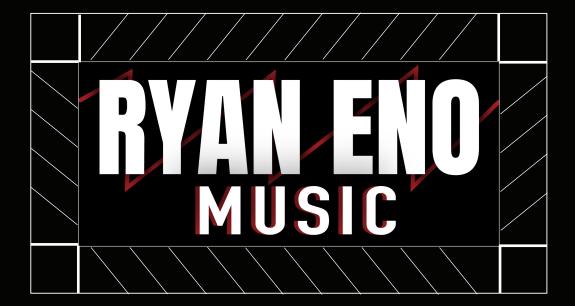

Colour Palette

The chosen colour palette consists of two reds and two neutral shades. This provides a masculine, confident and professional feel for the brand. The deep red is a reference to loud music in audio recording applications. This is also represented in the 'sawtooth' waveform of the logo.
